Accidental

A jury of seven in the Coroner's Court last week entered a finding of accidental death at the inquiry into the death of Walter Zeltins, 31, who was killed as a result of an explosion while setting a charge of gelig-nite at Sunshine quarries. Zeltins lived at Duke St., Sun-

Charles G. Martin, of Plumpton Avenue, Glenroy, inspector of mines, said he had been informed that Zeltins was placing explosives in bore holes when the accident occurred.

He had probably used salength of three-quarter inch water pipe instead of a wooden tamping rod, although he had been warned against the practice.

The jury recommended that notices be placed at all quarries warning against the danger of using metal tamping rods.
