## ACCIDENT AT AN EXPLOSIVE FACTORY.

TWO WORKMEN SEVERELY

BURNT.

A serious accident, which resulted in painful and dangerous injuries to two workmen named William Hose and John Clarke, occurred yesterday morning at the Nico Explosive Factory, St. Allens, near Beaglirook. The explosive known as "Nico" is a powerful compound used for blasting purposes and also for ordinary ammunition. The manufacture is carried on by a company called the Nico Explosive Manufacturing Company, the offices of which are in Little Collins street. The preparation of the material has hitherto been deemed unusually free from danger. The chief ingredients are subspecte, nitre, and sawdast. Bose and Clarke, who were the only two men working in the factory at the time of the accident, were engaged in suraping the heavy rollers used for compressing the material with wooden amapera, this operation being necessitated by the material viologing on the rollers. Suddenly there was a great flare up of flame unacompanied by any noise, and the fire instantaneously communicated itself to a box containing 60th, weight of the explosive which had not yet been treated in the mills. Hoss, who hast been blunded by the sudden amages and glare, became dazed, and fell headlong into the blasning reserve of material, while Clarke, although suffering severely, managed to stand his ground. Assistance was specify procured, and both men were taken to the Melbourne Hospital, where their woonds received attention from liv. Strong, who found them suffering from shock as well as from burns. Clarke was burnt on the face, arms, palms of the hands, back, and legs, and the injuries of Ross were show found to be extensive. The two men were relations by marriage, Clarke having married a sister of Ross are entertained at the floopital that toth matients will anywive them. It is supposed that the explosion was caused by the secidental presence of some foreign substance,
