## TRUSTEES OFFER ST. ALBANS' RESERVE TO COUNCIL.

Cr. F. Stenson and Mr. E. J. Luxford waited on the Braybrook council on Monday night offered to yest in it the recreation reserve. containing about six acres, and valued about £1,000, subject to the following conditions: that the reserve be maintained for all time for the use of the people of St. Albans; that in the event Sunshine becoming a borough the status of the reserve be the same as under the shire; that the reserve be known as Errington reserve. The Trustees had no thought of the council ever disposing of the land, but as Sunshine would at some time become a borough it was desired to make such arrangements as would keep ground for the people's use.

Mr. Luxford informed Cr. Mc-Kay that the Trustees had full power to sign the transfer.

The Trustees' offer is consequent on the proposal of the council construct ter Percy strect, on which the reserve abuts. As the reserve is technically private property the Trustees are responsible for share of the construction of the road, namely £476, but as they have no resources they propose to hand over the reserve to the council.

Gouncillors informally discussed the proposition, and it was decided to ascertain whether the Keilor council were willing to become joint trustees of the reserve with Braybrook. The secretary was instructed to communicate with the Keilor secretary with a view to enable that council to consider the subject National Library of Australia

council to consider the subject at a special meeting scheduled for Monday night.

On the metion of Crs. Pennell and Pridham the thanks of the council were accorded to Cr. Stenson and Mr. Luxford.

The Percy street construction scheme was deferred.
