

CAR CRASHES OVER BAYSIDE CLIFF

Man Killed; Another Hurt

Joseph Thomas Noonan, 35, was killed, and John Taylor, 40, suffered serious head injuries when the motor-truck in which they were travelling got out of control and crashed over a high cliff near Dromana on Saturday evening.

Noonan was employed as chef at Maryport Rehabilitation Centre, Mt Martha, and Taylor was a convalescent patient there. He was admitted to Heidelberg Military Hospital.

The truck, which belonged to Taylor, was caught on a tree about 20ft from the top of the cliff, but the men were hurled from it to rocks 75ft below.

KILLED BY SERVICE AMBULANCE

John Paterson, 42, of Servante st, Sunshine, suffered fatal injuries on Saturday afternoon when the bicycle he was riding collided with a RAAF ambulance in Barkly st, Footscray. He was taken to the Royal Melbourne Hospital by the ambulance, but died shortly after being admitted.

CHILD STRUCK BY CAR

Geoffrey Fiddian, 6½, of Havelock rd, Hawthorn East, suffered a fractured base of the skull yesterday afternoon when he was struck by a car at the corner of Burke and Pleasant rds, Camberwell. After first aid attention had been given by a doctor living near by, he was admitted to a private hospital in Canterbury in a critical condition.

TWO INJURED AT RICHMOND

Struck by a motorcycle near her home in Victoria st, Richmond, on Saturday, Lillian Parkin, 48, suffered a fractured leg. She was taken to St Vincent's Hospital. The motorcyclist, Alan White, 21, Union rd, Surrey Hills, suffered a fractured collarbone.
