RECONSTRUCTION OF THE PROPERTY TRAGEDY BRINGS

Reconstruction of Van Ness Avenue, Maribyrnong was placed on top priority by Sunshine city council on Monday, following the death of a man when his car hurtled into the river.

The need for Van Ness Avenue being taken over as a main road was emphasised by Cr. D. Thompson, who said it was already a main road as far as the Ford Motor Co. was concerned. It was their nain route between the Geelong and Broadmeadows factories and carried consistent heavy traffic.

Council agreed to place the work on top ward priority and ask the Country Roads Board to classify Van Ness Avenue as a main road. A CRB grant would mean a council liability of about £15,000.
