

Young Men Killed in Tragic Accidents

As a result of a tragic accident on Monday evening last when his motor cycle came into a collision with a truck in Hopkins St., Footscray, Constable Alex. Wynd, of 10 Second Ave., Sunshine, was killed instantly.

Deceased, who was a former member of the R.A.A.F. and a driver for Pioneer Tours, joined the police force about 12 months ago and at the time of his death was stationed at Melbourne.

The late Constable Wynd, who was 26 years of age, married Bettine Alice, daughter of Mr and Mrs Neilson, of Second Ave., and there is a baby daughter (Judith Dianne).

During his residence in Sunshine Constable Wynd was respected by all those who came into contact with him.

The funeral was a most impressive one. The police band, followed by several hundred members of the force marched from the home to the Wright St. railway crossing; and later assembled at the cemetery gates and marched to the crematorium. At the conclusion of the service conducted by Rev. R. F. Adams, formerly of St. Mark's Church, Sunshine, the Last Post was sounded by a member of the band. The service at the house was conducted by Rev. T. R. Vizard (St. Mark's, Sunshine).

The funeral, which took place on Wednesday to the Fawkner Cemetery, was carried out by Ernest W. Jackson & Sons, Williamstown.

Mr Percival Robert Fraser, of Ballarat Rd., Footscray (formerly of Sunshine) was killed in a distressing accident on Wednesday evening last.

A runaway horse in a cart crashed into Mr Fraser's panel van, in which he was seated and the shaft
