

**THE RAILWAY FATALITY AT
BRAYBROOK.**

An inquest was held yesterday at the Footscray court by Mr. Candler, the District Coroner, on the body of Benjamin Warner, the man who was killed at Braybrook on Tuesday evening by the Sandhurst express, and whose name was at first given as Jacob Gibbs. From the evidence of a fellow workman of the deceased, named Johnstone, it appeared that on the evening in question they were walking beside the line and conversing, when Warren suddenly stepped on to the line and the engine of the express came upon him and killed him instantaneously. The train was pulled up within 50 yards of the spot. The driver of the express and several other witnesses corroborated this evidence, and the jury returned a verdict of accidental death, with a rider to the effect that a notice should be placed at the south end of the station to prevent further accidents.
