YOUTH CLUB EQUIPMENT WAS IN FIRE - RAZED HALL

When fire destroyed St. Andrew's Church hall at Braybrook last week-end it destroyed also about £250 worth of equipment of the City of Sunshine Youth Centre.

Between 150 and 160 youth club members have been granted use of the Methodist Hall in Darnley St. for their activities, but they have nothing to act with.

A public appeal has been launched by the Mayor to replace the lost gear, and the Mayor heads the list of donations with £5. Anyone wishing to build on it may contact R. Brown, 9 High St., Sunshine (311-2860), Cr. Dobson, or the "Advocate" office.

Amongst the equipment lost were five mats, a vaulting horse, basketballs, boxing gloves, etc. None of it was insured.

A new building to cost £17,560 is expected to be ready for occupation by the club next August.
