The police were notified and after dragging with grappling frons for two and a half hours recovered

the body at 7 p.m.

Deceased was the only child of Mr and Mrs. J. Hyett, corner Sydney Street and King Edward Avenue, Sunshine, to whom deepest

sympathy is tendered.

The funeral which was largely attended took place on Monday afternoon from Sunshine to the Footscray Cemetry.
