A man named William Anderson was driving a horse and cart along the Keilor road, on the 15th inst., when the horse, which was a young one, and not much accustomed to harness, got frightened and bolted. The man was thrown out of the dray, and on being picked up he was found to be insensible; his foot was also dreadfully smashed. He was removed to the Hospital, and as soon as he had rallied a little from the shock, amputation was performed. He progressed favorably for a few days, when he graw worse, gradually sank, and died on the 25th inst. An inquest was held on the body yesterday, and the jury returned a verdict in accordance with the evidence.
